A Resolution Formally Supporting a Reinstatement of the Single Use Plastic Bag Ban on Campus

In the Senate of the Undergraduate Student Body here assembled,

- 1. Whereas, the Undergraduate Student Government represents the undergraduate student voice
- 2. at Bowling Green State University; and
- 3. Whereas, Bowling Green State University and the Undergraduate Student Government
- 4. aim to ensure all student voices are represented within the Senate; and
- 5. Whereas, BGSU's Climate Action Plan strives to achieve carbon-neutrality by 2040 through
- 6. the reduction of emissions, waste reduction & resource conservation, and awareness and
- 7. Education; and
- 8. Whereas, Plastic bags take multiple centuries to decompose in landfills or as pollutants in
- 9. the environment, and are not commonly recycled; and
- 10. Whereas, When it first went into effect in 2018 it was favored by members of the
- 11. Environmental Action Group (EAG), USG, and the BGSU student body; and
- 12. Whereas, In 2020, the CDC guidelines prohibited the use of reusable bags, thus bringing
- 13. back the return of single-use plastic bags; and
- 14. Whereas, With Covid-19 restrictions being lifted, we can now safely reinstate the plastic bag
- 15. ban with the support of EAG, USG, and the BGSU student body; and
- 16. Whereas, Sustainable alternatives such as reusable bags are already readily sold on campus
- 17. for \$1.00 and can be purchased using Falcon Dollars, BG1 Bucks, or cash; and
- 18. Whereas, In mid-September, BGSU Dining agreed to start phasing out the purchase and
- 19. distribution of single-use plastic bags; and
- 20. Whereas, the Undergraduate Student Government will continue to search for and support the
- 21. most sustainable and environmentally conscious bag on campus;
- 22. Therefore let it be resolved, USG, EAG, and the BGSU student body support the permanent
- 23. ban of the distribution of single-use plastic bags on BGSU's campus
