

## Change in Marriage Rate in the U.S., 1970 - 2008

- Since 1970, the marriage rate in the U.S. has been declining. This is estimated as the proportion of marriages per 1,000 unmarried women 15 years and over.
- Last year, 4,554,102 individuals aged 15 and older married.
- In 2008, about 3.5% of unmarried women got married. That is roughly 35 marriages per 1,000 unmarried women.

## Five States with the Highest and Lowest Marriage Rate, 2008

- In Utah, about 62 women per 1,000 unmarried women over the age of 15 got married in 2008. In other words, roughly 6.2% of unmarried women got married in that year.
- In Washington DC, about 23 women per 1,000 unmarried women over the age of 15 got married in 2008. About 2.3% of unmarried women got married in that year.

## Geographic Variation of the U.S. Marriage Rate, 2008

- Among the states with the highest marriage rate, the largest share is located in the western region of the U.S. (Utah, Wyoming, Idaho, Alaska, Colorado, Nevada, and Washington).
- Among the states with the lowest marriage rate, the largest share is located in the northeastern region of the U.S. (Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New York, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Connecticut, and New Jersey).
