BGSU Overview

- Public university founded in 1910
- Located 30 minutes south of Toledo, Ohio
- Campus comprises over 1,300 acres and 119 buildings
- 19,000+ students from 50 states and 80 countries
- Nearly 2,800 graduate students in 75+ programs





BGSU Overview





Step 1: Obtain admission to BGSU – Congratulations!

- Complete the Next Steps form linked from the admission decision letter in the application portal
- Set up your BGSU account and email address to receive additional information throughout the summer
- Request or submit official transcripts and diplomas from universities where degrees were earned – these can be mailed or hand-delivered when you arrive on campus
- Funding questions should be directed to the academic departments. There is also a website that lists all general assistantships



Step 2: Scan the following required documents to <u>iss@bgsu.edu</u>:

- Copy of passport information page
- <u>Financial statement</u> and supporting evidence, such as a copy of your (or your sponsor's) bank statements, affidavits of support, or certificate of loan
 - If your intended program is one year in duration, please use this <u>financial statement</u>.
- Copy of US visa (if you have one)
- Copy of US I-20 form (if you have one)



Step 3: Request that your I-20 be shipped to you

Step 4*: Pay the SEVIS fee

Step 5*: Apply for your passport (if needed) and <u>U.S. visa</u>

Step 6*: Notify BGSU when you obtain your U.S. visa by

scanning a copy of the visa to iss@bgsu.edu



^{*}For transfer students from a U.S. institution, you will not need to complete steps 4-6; instead, please complete the <u>transfer in form</u> with the assistance of the International Student Advisor at your current school.

Step 7: Complete the Financial Responsibility Agreement form (located in your MyBGSU "to-do list")

Step 8: Review the <u>orientation program</u> information and confirm your orientation plans <u>here</u>. (August 12-20)

All students are required to attend the mandatory orientation program.

Step 9: Secure housing using the assistance of BGSU's Off-Campus Housing Office

Step 10: Learn about mandatory student <u>health insurance</u> purchased through AETNA



Step 11: Follow us on Facebook where you can meet other international students, learn about BGSU, and ask questions you might have in this open forum. You can also connect with current international students by emailing our International Student Ambassadors at ambassadors@bgsu.edu

Step 12: Arrange your flight (or other form of transportation) plans to BGSU. We recommend that you fly into Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW)



Step 13: Request airport shuttle transportation and make hotel accommodations, if needed

Please note that we highly encourage students to arrive 2-4 days before orientation begins, especially if you need to secure off-campus housing. Hotel information can be found online

Step 14: Attend an EducationUSA pre-departure orientation in your home country

Step 15: Familiarize yourself with <u>American higher education</u> and expectations on <u>academic honesty</u>

Step 16: Attend International Student Orientation and

Graduate Student Orientation

Step 17: Complete your English placement test

This test is for placement into degree level English classes, not ESL.

Step 18: Complete the required health screening at

Falcon Health Center

Step 19: Begin classes at BGSU!



Tuition and Fees

- Graduate tuition among the lowest in the region
- Approximately \$27,500* total for two year programs
 - Tuition and fees
 - Books and school supplies
 - Room and board
 - Health insurance
 - Affordable cost of living in northwest Ohio
