• **September 21** Author visits BG to promote the Trevor Project. On Monday, September 21 at 7pm, the First Presbyterian Church (126 S. Church St., BG) will host nationally-known author Bill Konigsberg. This visit, co-sponsored by the church, Not In Our Town BG, and the City of BG's Human Relations Commission, is part of a driving tour Konigsberg is undertaking to raise awareness for the Trevor Project.

The Trevor Project, founded in 1998, is the leading national organization providing crisis intervention and suicide prevention services to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and questioning (LGBTQ) young people ages 13-24.

Bill Konigsberg joins us to talk about the resources offered by The Trevor Project. Bill hopes to talk with LGBTQ teens and their allies about suicide, depression and bullying. He will be providing information about TTP's services, reading from his books, and describing his own coming out experience.

Bill is an award-winning young adult author. His debut novel, Out of the Pocket, won the Lambda Literary Award in 2009. His second novel, Openly Straight, won the Sid Fleischman Award for Humor and was a finalist for the Amelia Elizabeth Warren Award and Lambda Literary Awards in 2014. It also made YALSA's Best Fiction for Young Adults

List, the TAYSHAS List as a top ten title, the ALA's Rainbow List, and was a Teens' Top Ten nominee. His third novel, The Porcupine of Truth, has received starred reviews from Booklist and School Library Journal.

His books are available for checkout at the Youth Services Desk at the Wood County District Public Library.

Prior to turning his attention to writing books for teens, Bill was a sports writer and editor for ESPN.com and The Associated Press. He lives in Chandler, Arizona, with his husband, Chuck, and their Australian Labradoodles, Mabel and Buford.
