2017 NWO Symposium Evaluation Report

The Northwest Ohio Symposium on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Teaching (NWO Symposium) is a regional conference held by the Northwest Ohio Center for Excellence in STEM Education (NWO) for STEM educators in northwest Ohio. The 14th annual NWO Symposium was held on November 18, 2017 at Bowling Green State University. The Symposium began at 9:00 AM and concluded at 2:35 PM.


Event Attendance

A total of 295 participants (attendees, presenters, and staff) attended the 2017 NWO Symposium. The table below displays a detailed summary of the attendance at the 2017 NWO Symposium as well the attendance numbers from the previous five NWO Symposia.



Attendance at the NWO Symposium has fluctuated heavily since 2010, when registration fees were first put in place. The figure below illustrates the trends in attendance for PreK-12 and pre-service teachers, higher education faculty, presenters/vendors, as well as for overall attendees. According to the figure, the strongest parallel to total attendance has been pre-service attendance; the two lines mirror each other almost perfectly. When total attendance was high in 2015, pre-service teachers made up almost 46% of the attendee population. This year, pre-service teachers made up just 28% of the attendee population. All other attendance categories have been mostly stable since the initial drop in attendance in 2010. NWO staff should consider the desired percentage of attendees from each category, and direct their recruiting efforts accordingly.



Forty-three percent of the attendees the 2017 Symposium were attending the Symposium for the first time. The chart below details the self-reported data from the attendees who completed the online post evaluation survey and answered the question regarding their past participation. Additionally, the majority of attendees (who completed the online evaluation survey) said they were "very likely" or moderately likely" to participate in future symposia.




Event Activities

For the 2017 Symposium, the format was changed to move the keynote presentation to the lunch block. The 2017 keynote address was given by BGSU Associate Professor, Dr. Gabriel Matney and was titled: "STEM Learning: The Power and Promise of Developing a Conjecturing Modality". The schedule for the day is below.

A total of 44 sessions were offered at the 2017 Symposium after four sessions were cancelled due to scheduling conflicts or illness for the presenters. The chart below shows the breakdown of sessions by strand. Most sessions (32%) were in the strand "Putting Creativity to Work: Teaching STEM with Innovation". 



Evaluation of the 2017 NWO Symposium

The purposes of the evaluation was to: (1) determine the quality and impact of the NWO Symposium, primarily indicated by the participants' perceptions regarding the value and usefulness of the Symposium, (2) document changes made to the 2017 event, and determine the impact of those changes on the quality of the NWO Symposium, and (3) identify ways in which future NWO Symposia might be improved. These purposes were accomplished by analyzing data from the paper session evaluation surveys and the online evaluation survey sent to presenters and attendees. The response rate was 74% for the online survey. In total 616 individual session evaluation responses were collected. Presenters were sent an individual summary of their session evaluation data in November 2017.

Session Attendance at the 2017 Symposium

In an effort to increase attendance at all sessions, fewer sessions were offered during each block of the day. For the first time in Symposium history, double sessions were not offered. Historically, attendance in the last block of the day has been very low as attendees leave early from the symposium. Below are charts detailing the average attendance per session in each block of the day as well as by session strand throughout the day.






Attendees' Perceptions of the 2017 NWO Symposium Sessions

Overall, the responses on the session evaluation surveys indicated that attendees perceived the sessions to be engaging and valuable. The table below shows the average score for each item on the survey when all of the sessions are taken together. The chart below provides a visual of the overall attendee perceptions of the symposium when all of the sessions are taken together.






Attendees' Perceptions of the 2017 NWO Symposium Overall

The online attendee evaluation survey was available to participants starting at the end of the Symposium and remained open for a little over two weeks with several reminders sent to the participants requesting that they complete the survey. In total 219 of the possible 295 attendees and presenters completed the online survey, a response rate of 74%. The responses to the online evaluation survey indicated that the attendees perceived the 2017 NWO Symposium to be a high-quality professional development experience. The chart below shows the responses to some of the items on the survey.



Attendees also ranked several factors of the Symposium, including the keynote, food, venue, and the NWO Symposium overall. The responses to these items are shown below. The keynote was rated slightly higher than in the previous year (44% excellent in 2016 to 58% excellent in 2017). The venue and symposium overall ratings stayed about the same as in the previous year. The food rating is down from last year (87% good or excellent in 2017). This lower rating is likely a result of the lower cost meal that was chosen to help save money in the symposium budget.



Conclusions and Suggestions for the 2017 NWO Symposium

The overall perception of the 2017 NWO Symposium was positive. Attendees perceived the event to be valuable and applicable to their professional practice, and presenters perceived the event to be valuable and appreciated the opportunity to share their work. The individual sessions were rated highly by the attendees, and the keynote address received many positive comments. Higher attendance in the sessions seems to have positively impacted the perceptions of the presenters and attendees.

The NWO staff should consider the following recommendations in regard to attendance:

- Continue to offer between 10 12 sessions per block with less than 10 sessions offered in the last block of the day. The lower number of sessions offered in each block definitely contributed to higher attendance in each session and the overall positive ranking by the presenters.
- Target recruiting efforts to match the desired participation from preK-12 educators, pre-service teachers, and higher education faculty/staff.

NWO staff should also consider the following general recommendations for the 2018 Symposium:

- Continue with the short list of presentations on the event day and not printing the large program. This had a positive impact on the budget and did not appear to be a problem for attendees.
- While the lunch was rated slightly lower, there were also several people that commented positively about the quality of the lunch. The lower cost of the lunch positively impacted the event budget. Several people commented that they wanted beverages in the morning. Staff did acquire a donation for coffee in the morning, however, in the future it might be worth securing this in advance and advertising it to the attendees. Additionally, a better location might be needed for the donated beverages so they are more easily accessible.
- Some people commented about having to go between two buildings as an issue with the event. This is likely due to the extreme weather on the day of the event but it is worth exploring the option of holding all sessions in Olscamp Hall, regardless of the format of the available rooms.
- Overwhelmingly, participants are hearing about the event from an NWO email or newsletter (68%). This is the most cost efficient method of advertising and staff should continue to use these methods for advertising while also exploring other low cost avenues for advertisement.
- Many attendees commented on the format of the day and how the new schedule, with the keynote during lunch and the shorter day, was a positive change to the event. Staff should consider keeping a similar format in 2018.
