Thompson Scholarship Programs

Beyond the financial benefit of the scholarship, our office strives to provide holistic support for each scholar. We serve as a springboard for growth while creating opportunities to connect, engage and serve from the time our scholars attend orientation through their graduation.

Scholarship Advisor

Each Thompson Family Scholar has a personal scholarship advisor they meet with one-on-one every semester. Our advisors provide support and guidance, reaching out and communicating with our scholars throughout the year to ensure they stay on track for success.

Our staff conducted 2,850 one-on-ones throughout the academic year, as well as hosted "Meet Your Advisor" small group sessions for our new cohorts.

Summer Link Program and Orientation

Our Summer Link helps our incoming first-year scholars acclimate to college life before the semester begins. Our staff and Summer Link Student Leaders facilitated programming helping new scholars connect, engage and serve together over several days. Participants connected with our staff and other scholars, learned about scholarship requirements and support, became familiar with academic resources, participated in personal and professional development sessions and got a jumpstart on their service hours.

During Summer Link 2021, 107 scholars participated in a variety of sessions including time management, imposter syndrome, meaningful service, Life Design and more. They also competed as teams in the TFS Olympics!

TFS Student Leadership Team

This year, we established a new structure for our Student Leadership Team. Sixteen scholars served on the leadership team as scholar representatives or as interns for our service, professional development and social initiatives. Members of the Student Leadership Team attended weekly meetings and celebrated a year of great work with a cookout at the end of the academic year.






