Women and Men of the House of Windsor, Part 1 - Queen Elizabeth II's parents: King George VI and Queen Elizabeth (Bowes-Lyon)

Teresa Marano, PhD – George VI, the "Reluctant King," assumed the throne when his brother, Edward VIII, abdicated to marry twice divorced, Wallis Simpson. George VI, better known as Albert, married Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon, and together along with their two daughters assisted the British people during the turbulent times of the late 30s and 40s. The early death of Bertie moved Elizabeth II on to the throne and the "Queen Mum" became the "grandmother" of the British nation for the next 50 years.

Women and Men of the House of Windsor, Part 2 - Queen Elizabeth II's sister, Princess Margaret and husband, Prince Philip

Teresa Marano, PhD – Princess Margaret, the second child of King George VI and Queen Mum, and the sister of Queen Elizabeth II, struggled to find love, happiness, and a role in the Monarchy of her sister. Her life before and after marriage to her husband Anthony Armstrong-Jones, their children, her extravagant lifestyle, and her death will be examined. Once Elizabeth met Philip in 1934 their friendship led to a marriage that lasted 73 years. Their marriage produced four children and endured the ups and downs of the monarchy in Great Britain and the Commonwealth. The loss of Philip's military career after Elizabeth's coronation saw Philip struggle to find a "new" career path within the confines of Monarchy.

Women and Men of the House of Windsor, Part 3 - Queen Elizabeth II's children: King Charles III, Anne Princess Royal, and Princes Andrew and Edward

Teresa Marano, PhD – Charles III was the longest serving Prince of Wales to become King. His turbulent first marriage, his extramarital affairs, and his support of offbeat causes sometimes have exposed the Monarchy to public scrutiny and placed him at odds within his family. Since Queen Elizabeth II's death, the world has watched as Charles has evolved from Prince to King. Anne Princess Royal withstood a kidnapping plot and two marriages to become the "hardest working" of the Windsor family. Prince Andrew had marriage, children, and a military career but his activities after joining the "Firm" have brought increased scrutiny for the immoral and illegal aspects of those activities. Prince Edward, the youngest in the family struggled to find a role in the entertainment field but eventually he and his wife joined to the "Firm" traveling to foreign locations to aid the Monarchy abroad and in sponsoring various health and community charities for the youth and aged populations of Great Britain.
