

*In the Senate of the Undergraduate Student Body here assembled,*

1. **Whereas**, the Undergraduate Student Government represents the undergraduate student
2. voice at Bowling Green State University; and
3. **Whereas**, Bowling Green State University and the Undergraduate Student Government
4. aim to ensure all student voices are represented within the Senate; and
5. **Whereas**, the Undergraduate Student Government values the safety and well-being of all
6. students; and
7. **Whereas**, it is known that heavy alcohol and drug use continue to be intense barriers to
8. student health and safety; and
9. **Whereas**, medical amnesty policies have already been shown to have removed a perceived
10. barrier to calling for medical services at other universities across the country; and
11. **Whereas**, medical amnesty policies have not been shown to increase heavy alcohol and drug
12. use; and
13. **Whereas**, the core of the university conduct process should always primarily revolve around
14. the education of our students
15. **Therefore, let it be resolved that**, the Undergraduate Student Government of Bowling
16. Green State University supports the Students for Sensible Drug Policy's proposed medical
17. amnesty policy.
18. **Therefore, let it further be resolved that**, the Undergraduate Student Government of
19. Bowling Green State University suggests that the University consider enacting this policy to
20. further protect and educate their students.
