Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education Group Requirements

Communication

Each student is required to acquire proficiency in written expression. GSW 1120 is required. Based on English placement tests, GSW 1100 or 1110 may also be required. The Office of Student Services will provide placement information before the first semester. As a result of placement, a student may be required to take a total of 11 credit hours of writing. However, no more than six hours of basic writing can be applied toward graduation. Each student should also acquire proficiency in oral communication. IPC 1020 or IPC 3060 is required.

BG Perspective

Each student is required to take PSYC 1010, and BIOL 1010 or 1040. In addition, one BG Perspective Humanities and Arts course is required, and one BG Perspective International Perspective course is required.

Basic Courses

Students are required to complete either MATH 1120 MATH 1150, or BUSE 1010. Students are reminded that they may have to take MATH 90 and/or MATH 95 before taking MATH 1120 or MATH 1150. MATH 90 and MATH 95 do not count toward graduation.

Advisor's Notes:

The Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education degree program leads students into the Bachelor of Science in Education in Early Childhood Education. However, some courses in the AAS programs do not fulfill the requirements of the BS degree. Please consult with your adviser.

Students can be admitted into the Bachelor of Science degree program upon successful completion of the program admittance requirements:

1. ACT composite score of 22, or Praxis I English and mathematics scores of 172 or higher, and a reading score of 173 or higher.
2. A minimum GPA of 3.2 at BGSU.
3. A grade of "C" or better in MATH 2130, IPC 1020, and GSW 1120.
4. A letter grade of "C" or higher in HDF5 2210, EDFI 3000, EDFI 3010, and EDTL 2040.

In order to participate in the AAS program, students must pass a criminal background check as required by the State of Ohio.

Each student must complete a sufficient number of electives to earn a minimum of 62 semester hours. At least 15 credit hours must be BGSU courses. Please check with your advisor for appropriate course selections.
