New NIH Biosketch Format

In May 2015, the NIH implemented a new biosketch format that will be required of ALL new grant submissions. It is significantly different than in the past. We recommend working on this early in the grant-writing process, as it will take more time than in the past. Some of the new requirements are:

- You can list up to 24 publications, instead of 15. Section A (Personal Statement) can have up to 4 that most directly relate to the proposal.
- There is a new section called “Contributions to Science” (Section C) to describe up to 5 of your “transformative” contributions to science.
- There is a 5-page limit instead of 4.
