NICHD has assigned a new grant number to the CFDR as we begin our new funding this month. Affiliates and students at NICHD-funded population centers are required to acknowledge population infrastructure support in all of their papers and presentations. The acknowledgment statement and new grant number can be found [at this link](#). Such acknowledgement is critical to convey the impact of federal funding on advances in research.

New Suite of Websites Available for Accessing American and International Time Use Data

A newly released component of IPUMS, [IPUMS-Time Use](#) consists of three integrated websites: the American Time Use Survey (ATUS-X), the American Heritage Time Use Study (AHTUS-X), and the Multinational Time Use Study (MTUS-X). Researchers can access and analyze time diary data through a powerful web-based interface that makes customized, easy-to-use data extracts and enables the creation of measures of time use in user-defined activity aggregations.
