Dr. Wheeler’s scholarly work revolves around one key problem—understanding the gendered and changing nature of sexual culture in the twentieth-century United States. *How Sex Became a Civil Liberty*, her most recent book, shows how the American Civil Liberties Union profoundly changed the ways Americans think about, legislate, and adjudicate sexual issues such as birth control, nudism, obscenity & pornography, abortion, sterilization, gay rights, rape, and sexual harassment.
