If you are a BFA Creative Writing Major and you've completed or are currently completing your final 2000-level class for the major, you will need to submit a BFA Portfolio and Application to continue in the BFA Degree Program. These will be due no later than the fifth week of the relevant semester. (Friday September 22, 2023 by 5pm for fall semester; Friday, February 9, 2024 by 5pm for spring semester)

Only BFA Majors that have completed or will complete the 2000-level classes listed by the end of the current semester (Spring 2023) will submit a portfolio at this time.

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

Complete the Portfolio

The portfolio should consist of a <u>single</u> document (PDF or .doc or .docx) with the following:

- A cover page with your name, address, email address, and phone number
- A three to five-page introductory essay.
 - The essay should reflect on the work you've done so far in the program, putting it into some critical, historical, or personal context.
 - The essay should also discuss the challenges you foresee ahead for you in writing.
 - Finally, the essay should discuss what you hope to accomplish in your writing during the course of your undergraduate studies.
- Between **10** and **15** pages of creative work in fiction and/or poetry and/or hybrid work. You can use work you have already submitted for BGSU creative writing classes.

Portfolio Formatting Guidelines

- 1. The portfolio should consist of a <u>single</u> document (PDF or .doc or .docx) with all of the above components
- 2. Fonts and Spacing

Cover Page and Introductory Essay: double-spaced pages, using 12-point type and a standard font such as Times Roman

Fiction and/or non-fiction: double-spaced pages, using 12-point type and a standard font such as Times Roman

Poetry: individual poems should be single-spaced, using 12-point type and a standard font such as Times Roman

- 3. Other Formatting Considerations
 - Start a new piece on a new page.
 - Bold Titles of individual pieces, using either 12-point type or 14-point type and a standard font such as Times Roman for these titles only.
 - Left align all work on the page

The portfolio should be attached to the email as one PDF, .doc, or .docx file and it should be titled with <u>your last name + "BFA Portfolio Submission"</u> (.doc, .docx, or .PDF)

Portfolio Review Process

Your portfolios will be reviewed by a committee of Creative Writing instructors. We may request, in the last three weeks of the semester, a brief interview with your major advisor. Based on the results of these interviews and the assessment of the portfolios by the BFA faculty, you will be invited to continue on in the major, or encouraged to take general requirement courses (or minor courses) and resubmit the following semester. You will be notified by letter or email of the results of the recommendation. No student will be permitted to continue in the BFA degree program without being invited through this process.

Because the portfolios are also used in part to assess our programs (e.g., to determine what students' goals are and how the program can help to meet them), we need to retain them for our files. They will not be returned. Please keep a copy for yourself.
