Secretary Report (T. Carver)

Treasurer Report (F. Olson)

- Disbursement for November was \$22.98 (reimbursed EDHD Dean's Office for Gordon sandwich bags) for MLK Day of Service. This gives a balance to the operating budget of \$4,295.46.
 - o There are 15 classified, 1 faculty member, and 1 young person who will be making sandwiches on January 18, 2016 from 8:30 am 10:30 am in 207 BTSU.
- The Foundation endowed side is \$98,507.53 with the spendable side remaining at \$2,097.25. Or, we can move money from the other Foundation Account to bring it to \$100,000.
 - O A decision was tabled in November for ideas on how to bring the endowed side of this account to \$100,000 for the sustaining of the \$3,000 in scholarship awards. This will be addressed at a later date. All ideas are welcome. If every classified staff member would donate \$2.00 * 600 = \$1,200, we would have more than enough to raise the endowed side to this reachable goal.
