Secretary Report (T. Carver)

Chair Houtz to send out to all CSC members from January to review via email.

Treasurer Report (F. Olson)

Need to work on getting up to \$100,000 for the Scholarship Fund by June; looking for fund raising ideas

- Suggested to send all Classified Staff an email and ask each person to donate \$2 toward this scholarship
- Special notice is being given to the CS Scholarship fund, which received \$101.50 in donations in December 2015

The CSC Budget has \$3,800 in operating, \$2,000 in spendable and \$4,800 in special events funds

Payment for OSCHE (\$300) was processed in January along with the travel expenses for our OSCHE representative, Terry Carver

ASC (A. Priehs)

Steve Krakoff gave updates on the current Master Plan, which has changed drastically ASC is filling openings on their Exec Team

ASC and CSC Brown Bag lunch discussion went well vesterday

President's Day statistics: had 600 more reservations this year than last

- Had 3,146 guests and 921 students attend
- Students attended from 14 states; 126 made early Housing payments; BGSU gave 522 tours of the campus!
- F. Olson made a suggestion that Parents be encouraged to take classes/finish their degree by offering a discounted rate if they have students attending (another incentive to receive SSI money from the State)

Retirees (L. Hammer)

January newsletter is out

- Discussed having it online for others to read
- Joint meeting/luncheon with UT Retirees in April

OSCHE (K. Newman)

Next quarterly meeting is in April

Explained the \$50 increase in dues for each institution

- Covers the cost of each institution taking turns paying for lunches in Columbus as this is an all-day meeting
- Lunches are typically sandwiches, chips, cookies, tea
- The OSCHE Executive Committee arranges for the lunches
- Discussed Vacation Pay for 9-month Part time Staff
- Wright State and Akron do not get this benefit either
- Ohio Revised Code is silent on this issue
- This is on the table with Sheri Stoll as part of the Salary Committee proposal, per G. Houtz
- Administration is looking at 16 hours Personal Time to give to 9 month PT employees, instead of Vacation Time
- This affects 14 people at BGSU

Chair Updates (G. Houtz)

Board of Trustees meet this Friday; topics include:

- 2.5% Increases in room rates and meal plans
- House Bill 64 low enrollment courses, which have already been identified
 - Collaborate with other universities on these classes

Read notes from her HR meeting with Viva, Leslie and Sandy (L. Hamman present)

- Discussed taking another look at the Red Circle policy; stand-by pay; handbook change; OPERS to our campus; review of pay ranges; the bonus policy; Admin. staff and restrictive OT pay
- The Salary Comp Committee will treat the Trades Stand By Pay as a side project

F. Olson would like to know what the process is for reviewing pay ranges

Sandy Heck is working toward a Retirement Fair in the Spring; the law has changed for "approved vendors" and has caused a delay
