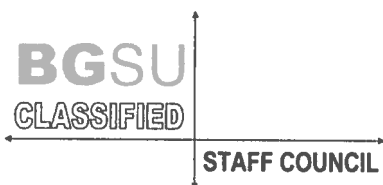
In 1,000 words or less, describe why this person deserves recognition for the "Spirit of BG" Award:

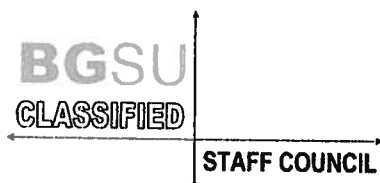
