Admission Guidelines

If a 2.50 cumulative GPA is not maintained, students will be placed on "probation" within the program. A grade of C or higher is required in CRJU 2100, which is the prerequisite course to all other CRJU courses. Grade of C or higher is required in all Core and Core Elective courses.
