Admission Guidelines

Admission to the College of Nursing at the University of Toledo is highly competitive. 80 open seats are made available three times per year (summer, fall, and spring). A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required, but due to the competitive nature of the admission process, a minimum 3.40 GPA is recommended. Admission decisions are made by the College of Nursing based on GPA, placement exams in math, critical thinking and reading & writing, Grade of “C” or higher is required for all prerequisites and university requirements.
