REPORT OF THE RESULTS OF THE FALL 2012 NEW STUDENT TRANSITION QUESTIONNAIRE

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BACKGROUND AND METHODOLOGY

The BGSU New Student Transition Questionnaire was developed in Fall 1997 as a means of gathering information about how well first-time first-year students were becoming acclimated to college life within their first a few weeks at BGSU. This report describes the results of the 15th administration of the survey in Fall 2012.

The 2012 survey was distributed to students who enrolled in GSW 1100, 1110, and 1120 classes at BGSU main campus in the weeks of September 17 and 24, the fifth and sixth week of the fall semester. Two thousand two hundred and ninety-seven surveys were returned. This represents about 77% of the students who enrolled in the classes (2981*).

Among the 2297 students who have answered the survey, 477 of them didn't provide their BGSU IDs and 1,820 of them did. Among the 1820 respondents who have provided a valid ID, 1764 of them were identified as first-time first-year freshman (FFF), 11 as first-time first-year transfer student (FFT), and 45 as non first-time first-year students (NFFS). FFT and NFFS students have been excluded from this study. The final counts for this study, therefore, is 2241 (2297-11- 45), which represents about 62% of first-time, first-year, freshman at main campus (1764/3622).

To examine how representative the survey respondents were of the population, the demographic characteristics of the 1764 FFF were compared to entire main campus Fall 2012 first-time, first-year freshmen class (3622). The survey respondents, in general, mirror the population (see Table below).

The survey results were analyzed by noting the percentages of all participants who provided various responses to each questionnaire item. Percentages may not always sum to 100 due to rounding. In addition, group differences (gender, race, and college) were investigated and significant differences are noted where they occurred.

2. Difference within Groups:

- Female respondents were more likely to report that "I miss home and my friends who are not at BGSU" and "I have taken advantage of mentoring or tutoring groups". Male respondents, on the other hand, were more likely say that "I am not concerned about alcohol use among students", "I am making friends easily", "I am not managing my time well", and "the noise level on my floor does not interfere with my ability to sleep or study within my personal room";
- While minority respondents were more likely to point out that "I have taken advantage of mentoring or tutoring groups", "I am not managing my time well", and "the noise level on my floor does not interfere with my ability to sleep or study within my personal room", European-American respondents were more likely to indicate that their classes are challenging, but they have figured out how to study effectively. European-American students were also more likely than their counterpart to claim that it was easy for them to adjust to the University, they liked the social life at BGSU and were satisfied with their living accommodations, and they would recommend BGSU to their friends;
- Among the respondents in the seven colleges, Musical Arts students were most likely to report that they have figured out how to study effectively and that they have actively involved with activities inside as well as outside of class; Academic Enhancement students were most likely to say that "I am having difficulty deciding a major or career". Compared with the respondents in the other colleges, students in the College of Business Administration and the College of Health & Human Services were more likely to take advantage of mentoring or tutoring groups to improve their study; students in Academic Enhancement, College of Education and Human Development, and College of Technology were more like to feel that they have missed home and friends who are not at BGSU.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

Most Fall 2012 new freshmen seem to be becoming academically and socially integrated into college life during their first a few weeks at BGSU. Although 61% of the survey respondents indicated that they missed home and friends who are not at BGSU, the majority of them did report that it was easy for them to adjust to the University (84%), they got along well with others on campus (90%) and made new friends easily (79%), and they liked the social life at BGSU (79%) and didn't feel lonely, left out, or isolated (81%). More than 70% of them pointed out that they were satisfied with their roommates as well as living accommodations, and more than 80% percent of them said that they would recommend BGSU to their friends.

The majority of the Fall 2012 incoming freshmen feel that the faculty and staff members they have encountered at BGSU had a good attitude toward students and it's easy for them to get in touch with teachers or staff outside of class. Forty-four percent of them found their classes challenging and yet only 23% of them have taken the advantages of mentoring or tutoring groups. Less than half of the survey respondents claimed that they have figured out how to study effectively and minority students even less likely say so than did European-American students. Some of the students still had trouble or difficulty to keep up with their studies (17%), manage time (20%), and declare a major or a career (23%). Working with students in coping with their first year study at the University might become an important issue in helping them succeed at college.

Caution is to be advised in interpreting the results due to the fact that (1) the response rate is only 62%; (2) we included 477 students who didn't provide their BGSU IDs in this study and we don't know if all of them are the first time first year freshmen.

Feedback concerning how this and other studies and how they can continue to be improved is always welcome.
