IN HIGH SCHOOL

- Musical preparation: Taking private lessons is the single most important thing you can do to prepare as a high school student. It is a rare student who has not studied privately prior to auditioning with, and being accepted to, the College of Musical Arts. We encourage prospective students to seek out those types of experiences in preparation for their audition.
- Academic preparation: The average ACT score for entering freshman in the College of Musical Arts is 26, and we have found that students with a higher level of academic achievement are the most successful in our programs. The work ethic you develop in your academic studies has a direct correlation to your musical training. It is recommended that students are adequately prepared academically if they are considering the College of Musical Arts.
- Musical performance: Musical performance at the high school level is critical to your success as a performance major. Through performing, students gain confidence, gain an understanding of the performance process and preparing a concert, and gain the technical skills they can build upon as they advance. Seek out as many performing opportunities at school and in your community and region as possible.
