GROUP I. ENGLISH COMP.

GROUP I. You must complete English 112 at BGSU or have it transfer in from another university. (See Question 12.) Only 6 hours of English Comp count toward graduation.

GROUP II. Students in the Arts and Sciences must complete a foreign language, unless four years of the same language were completed in high school. (See Question 33.)

GROUP III. SCIENCE-MATH

ELECTIVES

GROUP III. A Biology major automatically fills the science-math requirement with the biology, math, chemistry and physics courses that must be taken. The exception is that calculus (Math 131 or Math 134/135) must be completed. A proficiency exam is given to entering freshmen during preregistration. (See Question 32.) You may have to take other math courses to prepare you for calculus. Math 090 and 095 credits do not apply toward degree.

ELECTIVES: If you wish to take a course for fun or because of particular interest outside the major or requirements, it will count as an elective. (See Question 17.)

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES REQUIREMENTS (continued)

GROUP IV. SOCIAL SCIENCES

(4 courses in one or more areas)

GROUP IV. You must complete four courses in the Social Sciences. They may all be in the same department or you can do it buffet style and sample from a number of departments. Including Social Science courses at the 300- or 400-level will help you reach the 40 hours of upper level courses needed for graduation. Appendix B-1 lists the areas of Social Science from which you must select your four courses. At least two courses must be "BG Perspective" (formerly known as "General Education") classes.

GROUP V. HUMANITIES

(1 Lit. course, 1 Fine Arts course, plus 2 Humanities electives)

GROUP V. You must complete four courses in the Humanities. One must be a literature course; one must be a fine arts course. The other two courses may come from the list of courses in Appendix B-2 or may be more literature and fine arts. Do not hesitate to take 300- and 400-level courses on the list in Appendix B-2 to complete your requirements in this group. At least two courses must be "BG Perspective" (formerly known as "General Education") classes.

INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE

For those students who completed the foreign language requirements through 4 years of high school, at least one course in Group IV or V must be an IP (International Perspectives) course taken at 201, 202, or 212 level. These are marked as "IP" in Appendix B-1 and B-2.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY

At least one class must focus on a minority culture in the U.S. These classes are listed in Appendix D-1 under Cultural Diversity in the U.S. Some, but not all, of the classes will count as Social Science or Arts and Humanities choices.

BG PERSPECTIVE

At least 2 courses in each of Group IV and V must be courses appropriate as 'BG Perspective' courses. These classes are listed in Appendix D-1.
