

Express Scholarship Program



OVERVIEW

The Express Scholarship (EXSP) is designed to meet Air Force ROTC officer production requirements in specific fields of study and year groups. The list of approved fields and year groups varies on an annual basis and may change at any time without notice.

This program awards Type 1 or Type 2 scholarships and an annual textbook allowance*.

The Express Scholarship program is quota driven on a first come, first serve basis. Those who meet the qualifications are awarded the scholarship and do not meet a scholarship selection board. The processing of the scholarship must be completed at the local detachment.

Offers to fully qualified nominees can range between 2 and 3.5 years. An additional year may be made available to 5-year majors.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to apply for an Express Scholarship, an applicant must:

- Be a United States citizen
- Not already be a contracted cadet
- Pass the Air Force Officer Qualifying Test (AFOQT)
- Pass the AFROTC Physical Fitness Assessment (PFA)
- Pass a certified DODMERB medical exam
- Have at least a 2.5 cumulative college GPA
- Meet the age, moral, medical and other scholarship eligibility requirements for Air Force ROTC
- Be majoring in one of the majors currently eligible for an express scholarship

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

All Air Force ROTC scholarship recipients receive a non-taxable monthly stipend ranging from approximately \$300 - \$500, with an annual textbook allowance of \$900.

ELIGIBLE MAJORS AND YEAR GROUPS

The list of eligible majors for each year group changes as needed to meet Air Force officer production requirements. See your local detachment for the current list. Currently, Express Scholarships are being offered in the following majors:

- Students graduating in FY12, FY13, FY14, & 15
 - Foreign Languages (Type 1) - Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bengali, Cambodian, Chinese, Hausa, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Kasakh, Kurdish, Malay, Pashtu, Persian-Iranian/Persian-Afghan, Russian, Serbo-Croatian, Swahili, Thai, Turkish, Uighur, Urdu/Punjabi, Uzbek, and Vietnamese
 - Nursing (Type 2)[†]
 - Engineering: Computer and Electrical (Type 1)
