

## ***DAVID S. AND JILL M. HAINLINE SCHOLARSHIP***

David S. and Jill M. Hainline established this scholarship in 2002. David graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1983 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communications, specializing in radio, TV and film. While at Bowling Green State University, he was a member of the Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity. Shortly after graduation, David spent 16 years in the broadcasting industry, where he sold and managed all national accounts totaling over 12 million dollars for Infinity Broadcasting.

Jill graduated in 1983 from Arizona State University with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. Jill is the CEO and founder of Capitol Services, a destination management company in the Washington D.C. area and David is the president and owner of the company.

### **TERMS**

1. The intent of the donors is to establish a non-endowed scholarship known as the ***David S. and Jill M. Hainline Scholarship***.
2. The annual award will be dependent upon contributions received each year, all spendable income should be spent. The scholarship may be given to multiple recipients.
3. Funds awarded will be deposited directly into the recipient's bursar account to be distributed equally between spring and fall semesters.
4. The administrator of the scholarship will be the Chair of the Department of Telecommunications.
5. During their lives, the donors of this scholarship shall be notified each year of the name and qualifications of the recipient.
6. The recipient must be recognized as having been awarded the ***David S. and Jill M. Hainline Scholarship*** when other recipients of major scholarships and awards in the College of Arts & Sciences are acknowledged.
7. Publicity generated by Bowling Green State University may include the fund's name, its purpose and the amount of the award, as well as biographical information about the donors and recipients.

### **CRITERIA**

1. The recipient must be a rising sophomore, junior or senior in the Department of Telecommunications who has shown involvement in the student media organizations associated with the department.
2. The recipient must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.65 or above on a 4.0 grade scale.
3. Financial need must be a consideration in the selection of the scholarship recipient.

## **SELECTION PROCESS**

Selection of the recipients will be made by the Scholarship Committee of the Department of Telecommunications.

## **RENEWABILITY**

Unless the selection committee determines that another individual is more qualified, awards may be renewable as long as current or past recipients submit another application and continue to meet all criteria.
