### **National Survey of Family Growth: A New Survey Design, a New Website, and a New Listserv**

— The NSFG has begun operating under a new design. Since July 2006, the NSFG has been interviewing continuously. Over 5,000 men and women 15-44 years of age have been interviewed, and interviewing is expected to continue indefinitely. Data files are expected to be released every 2-3 years, beginning in 2009.

— The NSFG has a new listserv which will keep users of NSFG data files or reports up to date. You can sign up for the NSFG listserv by going to the NSFG [website](#).

— The NSFG web site has been re-designed and now includes new content: A new "Survey Description," which includes a summary of the new design; information for survey participants; PDF files of the 10 NCHS reports on the 2002 survey results; codebooks for Cycles 1 - 6 (1973-2002); questionnaires for Cycles 1- 6 (1973-2002); and a bibliography of over 550 studies based on the survey.
