07/03-present *Through a Sacred Lens: Creating New Spiritual Knowledge about Marriage, Pregnancy and the Transition to Parenthood*

I am the PI, in collaboration with Kenneth I. Pargament & Al DeMaris who are Co-PI's & S.P.i.R.i.T.

This longitudinal study examines multiple spiritual and religious dimensions of the transition to parenthood (N = 164 families). It involved four home visits with married couples during their first pregnancy and when their child was 3, 6, and 12 months old. Key new spiritual/religious constructs include the sanctification of marriage, the sanctification of the parent-child relationship, behavioral spiritual investment in family relationships (e.g., joint dyadic and family spiritual activities), and spiritual resources to cope with family stressors. Spiritual resources include spiritual struggles and positive spiritual coping by each partner and how the couple integrates religion/spirituality into their relationship to deal with family stressors (e.g., marital spiritual intimacy, theistic triangulation and mediation processes). Outcome variables include parental self-reports about their marriage, parenting, and their own and the baby's adjustment at all time points, direct observations of marital interactions at all time points, of mother-infant and father-infant interactions at 6 and 12 months post-birth, and of a triadic family interaction at 12 months post-birth. In addition to numerous studies authored by the PI/Co-PI's, several thesis and dissertation projects are being based on this project.
