

**Social Service Career Focus: Sample Program** (24 hours minimum)

This is a career focus that is relevant to a future in service professions such as human resource, social work, social agencies private and public and/or for students who seek advanced study in communication. All majors must take 24 hours of course work in IPC. PLEASE NOTE: IPC 306 Interpersonal Communication (for Non-majors), IPC 489 Internship, IPC 490 Independent Study, and IPC 491 Independent Readings do not count toward the 24 hours in IPC.
