Admission Guidelines

If a 2.50 cumulative GPA is not maintained, students will be placed on “probation” within the program. A grade of C or higher is required in CRJU 2100, which is the prerequisite course to all other CRJU courses. Grade of C or higher is required in all Core and Core Elective courses.

Criminal Justice Course Sequence and Prerequisites

The following courses require admission to the CRJU program (prerequisites listed in parentheses)

DHS 3000 (3) (MATH 115 recommended)

DHS 3300 (3)

CRJU 2200 (3) (fall only)

CRJU 2500 (3)

CRJU 3200 (3) (spring only)

CRJU 3300 (3) (fall only)

CRJU 4200 (3) (fall only)

CRJU 4800 (3) (seniors only)

CRJU Elective (3) – any CRJU course offered that is not one of the required courses above

CRJU 4910 (9) & 4920 (3) (Practicum and Practicum Seminar) – 480 Internship experience taken no sooner than the summer before senior year, however, numerous requirements must be met prior to establishing the practicum. Full details can be found on the department website. Students are encouraged to develop a detailed plan of study with consultation from the faculty advisor upon admission to the CRJU program.
