

# 2011 Nursing (BSN “Basic” Program) Advising and Degree Planning Guide

## Admission Guidelines

Admission to the College of Nursing at the University of Toledo is highly competitive. 80 open seats are made available three times per year (summer, fall, and spring). A minimum GPA of 2.50 is required, but due to the competitive nature of the admission process, a minimum 3.40 GPA is recommended. Admission decisions are made by the College of Nursing based on GPA, placement exams in math, critical thinking and reading & writing, Grade of “C” or higher is required for all prerequisites and university requirements.

## Nursing Course Sequence and Prerequisites

Depending on the student’s admission start date, the following plans are an example of the courses:

### Nursing program “junior” year:

Summer	Fall	Spring:	NURS 3010, 3110, 3130, 3170, 3180 (15 hours)
Fall	Spring	Summer:	NURS 3120, 3210, 3630 (15 hours)
Spring	Summer	Fall:	“off” semester

### Nursing program “senior” year:

Summer	Fall	Spring:	NURS 3620, 3640, 4010 (15 hours)
Fall	Spring	Summer:	NURS 4020, 4030, 4250, 4950 (15 hours and graduation)
