The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at Bowling Green State University is seeking a tenure-track faculty member to contribute to the department's forward momentum. Individuals are sought to foster further development in educational, research and clinical training in our undergraduate, master's, and Ph.D. programs. The departmental faculty is engaged in a wide range of teaching and research, e.g., doctoral mentoring, innovative pedagogies and the scholarship of teaching and learning, national and international research collaborations, grant-funded research, and many other significant scholarly activities. The department is housed in a modern building with new academic, clinic, and research facilities. Communication Sciences and Disorders is housed in the College of Health & Human Services, which is committed to providing an environment that promotes collaboration and multiple opportunities for professional excellence. Description:

This tenure-track position is for the rank of Assistant Professor in Communication Sciences and Disorders, speech-language pathology or speech-language science emphasis, available August 2012. This is an academic year (nine-month) appointment with possible summer employment, if desired.

Qualifications:

Doctorate in Communication Sciences and Disorders or related field; ABD considered. CCC-SLP and Ohio license (or eligible) preferred. Strong candidates in all areas of specialization are urged to apply. The successful applicant must either have demonstrated or show strong potential for developing an externally funded research program.

Responsibilities:

Teach undergraduate, masters, and Ph.D. courses in areas of expertise; conduct research in areas of expertise; seek extramural funding; participate in related service, scholarly and clinical activities, as applicable.

Salary:

Competitive and commensurate with peer institution levels for rank and position and in keeping with candidate experience and credentials.

Departmental Information:

The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders is one of nine departments/programs in the College of Health and Human Services. The Department offers a B.S. in communication sciences and disorders, an M.S. in speech-language pathology, and a Ph.D. in communication sciences and disorders. The master's program received CAA re-accreditation for 2011-2019. CDIS has approximately 180 undergraduate, 55 master's, and 10 doctoral students. It has 13 full-time (12 tenure-track) and 6-8 part- and full-time clinical faculty, and a full-time clinic director. The Department's Speech and Hearing Clinic is a vital part of the program, providing opportunities for students to gain supervised experience in clinical service delivery.

University and Community Information:

Bowling Green State University is the city's largest employer. Approximately 20,000 students (including ~2900 graduate students) attend BGSU with 839 faculty on a 1,338-acre campus in the northeast sector of the city. Bowling Green is a vibrant community with approximately 30,000 residents. The city has a diverse retail and industrial base, and is conveniently located on Interstate 75, 23 miles south of Toledo, 75 miles south of Detroit, 70 miles south of Ann Arbor, 240 miles east of Chicago, 120 miles west of Cleveland, and 115 miles northwest of Columbus. The Bowling Green City School system includes a senior high school, a newly constructed middle school, and three elementary schools. The campus and community enjoy a wide variety of cultural events.
