# Requires Program Admission

NOTE: Undergraduate students and degree-holders seeking initial licensure must meet all specified requirements, including satisfactory completion of Praxis Exams.

<b>ADVISING NOTES</b>
-----------------------

- (1) BIOL 104 is among the prerequisites for KNS 360 and PHYS 101 is among the prerequisites for KNS 370. PSYC 101 is a prerequisite for EDFI 302. All three courses may also be used to fulfill BG Perspective requirements.
- (2) EDFI 408 is a required education course in this program and may also be used as a Cultural Diversity elective in BG Perspective.
- (3) KNS 432, 472, and 492/497 require PETE program admission.
- (4) All selective or required KNS/DANC/PEG courses must be taken for a letter grade (i.e., no S/U credits).
- (5) Application for internship (student teaching) is completed at a sign-up meeting held the second Wednesday of each semester for students planning to intern the following semester.
- (6) Depending on course selections in Movement Performance and BG Perspective categories, the program may require additional hours of free electives to meet university graduation requirement of 122 hours.
- (7) At the time of licensure application, no PETE methods courses (KNS 247, 312, 432, 472, 492, and 497) may be older than five years.
- (8) College core content requirements regarding Behavior Management and Technology are integrated throughout the PETE major.
- (9) The following courses should be taken in sequence: KNS 137/138, 247, 312, 432/472, and 492/497.
- (10) A passing score on the Praxis II test—Physical Education Content Knowledge—is required to be eligible for student teaching.
  - a. Praxis II test requirements are subject to change.
  - b. Check Ohio Department of Education requirements for physical education at the point of licensure application.
- (11) “C” or better is required in EDHD 201 and in EDFI 302.

**REMINDERS:**

- (1) From the MyBGSU webpage, click on the “My Degree Audit” link to access your degree audit.
  - (2) Meet with your advisor at least once each semester. Bring your checksheet and degree audit to all appointments. Names of advisors and other important information can be obtained by checking Blackboard (MyBGSU).
  - (3) Apply for Program Admission in the Kinesiology Division Office (212 Eppler South) no later than the semester prior to registering for KNS 432 or 472.
  - (4) SENIOR YEAR: You must apply for graduation on-line prior to the term deadline or afterward in Room 365 Education Building; complete an application for licensure during your internship semester--you will receive instructions for doing so during the required meeting that precedes internship.
  - (5) Complete the last 30 hours immediately preceding graduation at BGSU. If you wish to deviate from this policy you must request permission to do so in 365 Education Building.
  - (6) Students must pass (“C” or better) their Internship (Student Teaching), complete all degree requirements, have a 2.5 accumulative grade point average, and successfully complete the required Praxis II tests to be eligible for licensure upon graduation.
