## EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY DEFINITIONS

### **White, not of Hispanic Origin:**

A person having origins in any of the original people of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East who are not Hispanic origin.

### **Black, not of Hispanic Origin:**

A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa who is not of Hispanic origin

### **Hispanic/Latino:**

A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race.

### **American Indian or Alaskan Native:**

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

### **Asian or Pacific Islander:**

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Indian subcontinent, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Island, and Samoa.

### **Not Specified:**

A person who has origins in more than one of the defined groups.

### **Veteran:**

A person who served in the U.S. armed forces and who was discharged with other than a dishonorable discharge.

### **Vietnam Era Veteran:**

A person who served on active duty for a period of more than 180 days, any part of which occurred between August 5, 1964, and May 7, 1975, and who was discharged or released with other than a dishonorable discharge, or who was discharged or released from active duty for a service-connected disability if any part of such active duty was performed between August 5, 1964, and May 7, 1975, and who was discharged or released within 48 months preceding an alleged violation of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Assistance Act.

### **Disabled Veteran:**

A person entitled to disability compensation under laws administered by the Veterans' Administration for disability rated 30 percent or more, or a person whose discharge or release from active duty was for a disability incurred or aggravated in the line of duty.
