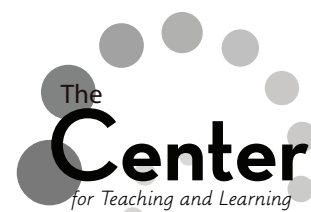
I've Graduated: Now What? 201 University Hall
