

## **BGSU Greek Risk Management Questions**

### **What Constitutes a Greek Chapter Event Outside the Chapter House?**

1. Who paid for the event?
  - Alcohol
  - Hall rental
  - Transportation
  - Everyone throwing in money to purchase alcohol
2. How was the event advertised?
  - Flyers in a chapter house
  - Chapter listserv
  - Announcements at chapter meetings
3. What percentage of the members was present?
  - 50% or more
4. Were Officers present?
  - President
  - Social chair

Most national policies are more restrictive such as 10% or 6 or more members.

### **What are the Rules for Events at Bars?**

- Events at bars are known as 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Vendors
- The bar must be a licensed bar
- The bar must have at least \$1 million worth of insurance and show proof
- The fraternity or sorority must regulate who gets into the bar (members, not bar staff) and have a guest list
- There can be no drink specials or any kegs "thrown in"
- Events at bars will lessen liability, but will not eliminate it

### **What happens if you violate your national policy?**

- The \$1 million dollar liability insurance policy is cancelled
- The undergraduates are on their own to pay for any legal fees or settlements
- Most members are still under their parent's homeowners insurance policies which means they will be drawn into paying for any damages
- Your national insurance rates will double (just like when someone gets a DUI their rates skyrocket)
- Since BGSU risk management policies mirror the national policies, there will likely be a BGSU policy violation as well

### **What are the Rules for Recruitment and Alcohol?**

- All recruitment functions are to be alcohol-free, regardless of age or location
- Recruitment events are social events with one or more potential new members present
- No recruitment events can be held at bars

### **How does BYOB work?**

- All events are BYOB
- Individuals are responsible for bringing their own alcohol
- There is a 12 pack limit to the amount individuals can bring
- Kegs, bars and cases or beer are prohibited
