Spring 2006 Greek Report Executive Summary

This report is sent to all BGSU Faculty/Staff to inform them about the BGSU Greek Community. Below is the statistical report on fraternities and sororities for Fall 2005 at BGSU as well as this executive summary. We hope this report sheds some light on the BGSU Greek Community.

Scholarship

- For the second semester the Greek GPA is above the non-Greek GPA (2.92 vs. 2.88).
- Fraternity men achieved a higher GPA than undergrad men (2.8 vs. 2.7), while sorority women were slightly below undergrad women (3.01 vs. 3.02).
- Chapters must achieve a 2.50 semester GPA to have social privileges. Three groups did not have social privileges this Spring semester due to falling short of this standard.
- \$14,663 or \$9/Greek member were provided by chapters to reward their members for good scholarship; a good gauge of the group's commitment to academics.
- A full-page BG News ad (costing \$1,000) congratulated the 350 Greeks who achieved Dean's List status Spring.
- Gamma Sigma Alpha - National Greek Academic Honor Society inducted 30 new members Spring semester. Membership requirements are junior or senior status and a 3.5 cumulative GPA required for admission, or achieving Dean's List during the junior or senior year.
- Faculty Advisors are provided \$100 grants each semester to reward their members for good scholarship. This increases to \$150 this Fall semester.

Recruitment & Retention

- 100 women joined the 14 Panhellenic sororities during Spring informal recruitment, bringing the annual total to 402. Panhellenic sororities below 85 members are required by their national headquarters to continue to recruit until they reach 85 members.
- 67 men joined the 15 IFC fraternities Spring semester, down slightly from the previous Fall, bringing the annual total to 299.
- Omega Phi Alpha - Service Fraternity joined the Greek Independent Board (the 4th Greek Council) this Spring, bringing the total number of groups to six for this council.
- 21 students joined the seven National Pan-Hellenic (NPHC) groups through the "intake" process this Spring semester.
- 91% of Spring new members persisted in school and in their group through June, indicating students and chapters are making good choices during recruitment.
- 85% of Greeks recently surveyed were either very satisfied or satisfied with their BGSU Greek experience.

Service & Philanthropy

- 30,231 hours or 19/Greek member of hands-on community service was performed by Greeks for Spring semester, up slightly from the previous semester.
- A record \$45,082 or \$29/Greek member was raised for philanthropy by Greeks for Spring semester.

Leadership & Involvement

- A record 1,166 Greeks, or 75%, were involved in other student groups at BGSU, indicating students are having a well-rounded campus experience.
- Order of Omega - National Greek Leadership Honor Society inducted 20 new members (jr. or sr. status, 3.0 GPA and extensive leadership required for admission) Fall semester.
- A comprehensive leadership program is provided that includes a new member program, an emerging leaders program, a leadership course, and a President's retreat.

Advisors, Parents & Alumni

- All chapters have an advisor who is an initiated member and who works closely with the chapter and their officers weekly.
- Advisors are included in many aspects of the chapters and meet regularly with Greek Affairs to reinforce the founding principles of their groups.
- Parents receive a four-page newsletter each semester that includes many updates including latest Greek Report.
- 22,000 BGSU Greek Alumni receive a semesterly e-newsletter that includes updates about the Greek Community and the latest Greek Report.
- If anyone is interested in serving as a Faculty Advisor please contact Greek Affairs at rbinder@bgsu.edu. Faculty Advisors spend roughly one hour per week advising their group.

Housing

- Approximately 600 Greeks are housed in 34 houses or residence halls owned by BGSU.
- All Greek Houses have a live-in graduate student staff member who is employed, supervised and trained by Greek Affairs.

Discipline

- Three chapters were found responsible for violating either BGSU or Greek Council policies for Spring (Phi Delta Theta, Pi Kappa Phi and Sigma Nu fraternities) with all being placed on probation for one year and hosting a risk management seminar with 80% attendance.
- Greek Affairs operates a Hazing Hotline to report violations anonymously (419-409-0731) along with any potential policy violations. At no time does anyone have to identify themselves.
