True or False:

1. _____ A player can participate as long as they put tape over their jewelry.
2. _____ A player can dribble the ball off their own foot and still retain possession.
3. _____ A player can dribble continuously with the ball from one end of the field to the other.
4. _____ Any player can dive for a loose ball as long as it is not in contact with the floor.
5. _____ Teams are allowed to stall, by passing the ball back and forth among team members, rather than attempting to score.
6. _____ A defender is allowed to knock the ball from the offensive player's hands while they are in possession of it.
7. _____ Goalies with possession of the ball in their own goal area are allowed to kick the ball downfield.
8. _____ While in possession of the ball, goalies are not allowed to leave their goal area.
9. _____ Cleats are allowed.
10. _____ Team shirts may have numbers taped onto their backs.
11. _____ When a goalie receives a 2-minute penalty, a field player may serve their penalty for them.
12. _____ If the referee sees a foul committed against the player in possession of the ball, the ref must blow the play dead immediately and award a free-throw from the spot of the foul.
13. _____ For throw-ins, the thrower must have one foot in contact with the sideline, and the other foot behind the sideline, for the throw to be executed properly.
14. _____ Any player receiving a second warning for a repeated foul or conduct during the same game, automatically receives a 2-minute suspension.
