Spring 2008 Greek Report Executive Summary

This report is sent to all BGSU Faculty/Staff to inform them about the BGSU Greek Community. On the reverse side is the statistical report for Fall 2006.

Scholarship

- The Greek GPA was above the non-Greek GPA (2.93 vs. 2.88) with the gap widening.
- Those groups above the All-Men's and All-Women's GPA split a pool of \$7,500 each semester to improve their houses.
- The average undergraduate fraternity and sorority ACT score equaled the undergraduate ACT score of 22
- Five groups fell below the 2.50 GPA minimum (same number as last semester) and will not have social privileges for Fall. Each will meet with the Greek Scholarship Board to map out a scholarship plan and will have \$1,000 in incentive monies to reward good scholarship.
- \$18,391 or \$11/Greek member were provided by chapters to reward their members for good scholarship, showing great support for scholarship.
- Gamma Sigma Alpha – National Greek Academic Honor Society inducted 30 members (jr. or sr. status and a 3.5 cumulative GPA for membership).

Recruitment & Retention

- 228 students joined fraternities and sororities Spring (735 for the year), **up 9% from the previous Spring** (102 women joined the 14 Panhellenic sororities, 87 men joined the 15 IFC fraternities, 18 joined the seven National Pan-Hellenic (NPHC) groups, and 21 joined the six GIB groups).
- 20% of the freshmen class joined a fraternity or sorority this year, the same percentage as those who indicated on the Freshmen Survey they would.
- In order to foster growth, groups who achieve the following size split a pool of \$6,000 each semester (IFC: 50, Panhellenic: 70, NPHC: 13, GIB: 12).
- Iota Phi Theta, an NPHC group (there are only 9 in America) came to BGSU this Spring bringing the total # of NPHC groups to 8.
- 89% of first-year Greek students were retained to their second year, compared to 74% for the campus.

Service & Philanthropy

- A record 32,890 hours, or 20/Greek member, of hands-on community service was performed by Greeks for Spring in the local BG community.
- A record \$69,169, or \$40/Greek member, was raised for philanthropy by Greeks for Spring.

Leadership & Involvement

- 53%, or 924 members, of the Greek Community were involved in other BGSU student groups, thereby getting a well-rounded BGSU experience.
- Order of Omega – National Greek Leadership Honor Society inducted 20 members (jr. or sr. status, 3.0 GPA and extensive leadership).
- The Greek Leadership Program includes a new member program, emerging leaders program, a President's retreat and two courses for credit.

Advisors, Families & Alumni

- All chapters have an advisor who works closely with the chapter and officers, and are copied on all Greek Affairs correspondence.
- Greek Families receive a four-page newsletter each semester that includes many updates including latest Greek Report.
- 23,000 BGSU Greek Alumni receive a semesterly e-newsletter that includes updates about the Greek Community and the latest Greek Report.
- Half the Greek groups have established BGSU Foundation accounts to receive educational gifts from alumni, parents and friends.

Housing

- 579 Greeks are housed in 32 houses owned by BGSU, with a live-in graduate staff member who is supervised by Greek Affairs.
- BGSU houses more NPHC and Multi-Cultural groups than nearly any other campus (4 of the 7 NPHC and 1 of the 6 GIB groups housed).
- New this year was a shared Conklin house by Kappa Alpha and Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternities.
- Due to the success of the above shared house, next fall another Conklin house will be shared by Alpha Tau Omega and Phi Kappa Psi fraternities.
- With the addition of the shared houses, next fall 609 Greek students will reside in on-campus Greek housing, or 10% of the overall housing beds.

Discipline

- Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. was found responsible for hazing for Spring and is suspended for two years, but may apply after one year for reinstatement provided no further violations occur, and they will meet with the Director of Greek Affairs monthly.
- Greek Affairs operates a Hazing Hotline to report violations anonymously (419-409-0731) as well as any other alleged violations.
