

Philanthropy Cup 2009

Option A – Competitive Philanthropic Event

- To fall under option A and be a competitive event, the hosting chapter must:
 - hold an event that allows teams to compete against one another
 - have a clear first, second, and third place winner
 - declare a spirit award for the most enthusiastic team

Option B – Charitable Fundraising Event

- To fall under option B and be a charitable fundraising event, the hosting chapter must:
 - hold an event that is not a competition but requires the attendance and participation of other organizations and groups

Points Awarded to the Hosting Chapter

Hosting or holding an event:

- Option A – 100 points will be awarded for holding a competitive philanthropic event.
- Option B – 50 points will be awarded for holding a charitable fundraising event.
- 25 extra points will be awarded for any event that is co-hosted by a non-Greek organization.

Money Raised:

- \$1=1 point. Each dollar raised equals one point for all events.
- If you are co-hosting an event with another organization on campus your organization will be credited with the amount that they walk away with. So if \$1,000 is raised each chapter has \$500 and each are awarded 500 points.

Non-Greek Participation:

- 10 points will be awarded if a non-Greek organization participates in any event.

Points Awarded to Guests

Attendance: 10 points (1-4 non competing members) or 20 points (5+ non competing members)

- These points are rewarded for guests that come as spectators to support competitive event (Option A) or guests who attend a fundraiser (Option B).
- Chapters should have a sign in sheet to track this attendance so that credit can be given to the chapters who earn points under this category.

Spirit: 20 points (Optional for Option B and Mandatory for Option A)

- The host will award these points at their discretion to the chapter that is the most enthusiastic.

Specific to Option A:

- Participation: 50 points
 - 50 points will be awarded to chapters who send a team that meets the specifications of the hosting chapter and adheres to the rules in place for the competition. 20 extra points will be given for any additional teams (i.e. if a chapter sends 2 teams 50 points will be given for the first team and 20 for the second, totaling 70 points).

- First/Second/Third place winners: 35/25/20 points
 - The hosting chapter will report the rankings rewarding 35 points to the first place winner, 25 points for second place, and 20 points for third place.

Requirements

- Details of an event (registration sheet, cost, location, time, dates, etc) should be reported as soon as possible to the Panhellenic VP of Service or IFC Philanthropy Chair. This information should be submitted by either the last Philanthropy Chair meeting of the spring semester or first meeting of the fall semester.
- All of the required information for the event that is listed above must be turned in within one week after the event.
- All information must be accurate.

Date Selection

- At the end of each semester an all council philanthropy roundtable will be held and chapters will choose dates in order of the previous semester grade point average as listed on the Greek Report.
- Only two philanthropies will be scheduled on the same day and the times can not overlap to ensure equal opportunities for participation.
