Criteria for Acceptance into the Dance Major

1. Completion of 30 semester hours (any university courses) including: "C" or better in ENG 112, IPC 102, DANC 115, DANC 120, DANC 150, and DANC 326.
2. University GPA (from DARS audit) of 2.5 or higher.
3. Formal application completed by student, signed by advisor, and approved by the Kinesiology Division (212 Eppler South).
4. Satisfactory ranking in technique/performance audition into Dance Program.

SENIOR YEAR: You must apply for graduation on-line prior to the term deadline or afterward in 365 Education Bldg. You also must complete your last 30 hours immediately preceding graduation at BGSU. To deviate from this policy, you must request permission in Rm.365 Education.
