Participate in a long-term study of the reproductive behavior of smallmouth bass in northern Wisconsin!



We have studied the reproductive behavior of smallmouth bass in northern Wisconsin lakes for more than twenty years. You will learn basic field techniques used to study the behavior and reproductive ecology of fishes under the direct supervision of faculty from the University of Wisconsin, Bowling Green State University and Colorado State University. We work closely with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and you will have an opportunity to participate in their population estimation procedures and other basic research activities. This is a great opportunity to prepare yourself for graduate studies in behavior, ecology or fisheries biology.
