- The BGSU Career Conversation & Mentorship Program was presented to the Career Center by ASC.
 This program connects staff with undecided students. The beta group is running this year and alumni will be included next year.
 - Interested staff should contact the Career Center.
 - Mentors should meet with their student mentee once a month on campus in a mutually agreed upon space.
 - Students and staff mentors self-enroll in the program.

University Council:

Hearing of the Public - Opportunity for guests to address the council:

- Guest thanked ASC for sending out the semester letter.
- Send Suzy Saunders any ideas on how to get the word out about HR trainings to administrative staff.

Discussion:

- Chet Hesson asked if anyone has been negatively impacted by the closure of the bookstore.
 - Michael Ginnetti mentioned that it has been a struggle for the students in the College Credit Plus program to get and store books.
 - Student Athlete Services has had increased work due to this closure. Staff are ordering books on their p-card for 250+ students on book scholarships. This used to be handled by the bookstore and billed to the department.
 - An increase of students visiting the library looking for the textbooks on reserve because they
 don't have the books they need in time.
 - Transfer students struggling as they came from universities with bookstores and they weren't prepared for the change.
- Stampers no longer allows for drop off of printed items to be bound, cut, etc. Everything has to be submitted online. Fed Ex off campus to help with these services but the price is more than double what Stampers was in the past.

Treasurer's Report: No money has been spent to date. Donations can be made to the Administrative Staff Scholarship Fund (#30004) and the Administrative Staff Support Fund (#301996).

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the June meeting were sent out on June 6. The June minutes were approved 1^{st} by Rebecca Lyons and 2^{nd} by Leslie Galan. The motion passed.
