- BGSU's annual New Music Festival features performances of new music, visual arts presentations, lectures, seminars and related sessions.
- Produced by WGTE Public Media, the radio show "Living American Composers: New Music from Bowling Green," draws primarily on live concert recordings from the BGSU New Music Festival and Music at the Forefront concert series, as well as commercial recordings featuring the Bowling Green Philharmonia and the BGSU Wind Symphony.
- The MidAmerican Center for Contemporary Music is an award-winning national center devoted to the study, performance, creative work and promotion of new music within the College of Musical Arts at Bowling Green State University.
- The annual Toledo Symphony Orchestra Reading Session offers the opportunity for student compositions to be read, workshopped and recorded by the symphony.
- Available resources include travel grants, guest artists, excellent facilities, and a robust network of alumni throughout the world.
- Students involved in music technology explore analog and digital audio techniques, computer music programming, experimental audio/animation, real-time interactive performance systems, and recording techniques.

#### **Our Students Find Jobs**

Alumni from the composition program are numbered throughout the world in the music profession. Our graduates have been accepted into prestigious Master's and Doctoral programs such as Eastman, Indiana University, Stanford, and the University of North Texas. Alumni have gone on to obtain university teaching positions and related work in the private sector.
