Environmental health is a core area of public health. Environmental health professionals work in the area of environmental health, safety, sanitation and hygiene. Students may obtain jobs in this field immediately following graduation.

Points of Pride

- Environmental health graduates will be qualified to take the Registered Environmental Health Specialist/Sanitarian-in-Training examination leading to professional licensure.
- Classes are taught by dedicated faculty with professional public and environmental health experience.
- The 122 credit hour curriculum exposes students to the concepts necessary for success in the public and environmental health workplace. Students have the option to take many of the courses online.
- Students pursue a 180 hour internship with a public health organization of their choice for hands-on experience and to better understand their career options and preferences.
- According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics employment of environmental scientists and specialists is projected to grow 11 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.

Career Paths

Environmental health professionals include many titles, such as environmental health practitioner, environmental health officer, and sanitarian. Most environmental health professionals specialize in a particular area, such as drinking water, food safety, school safety, vector control, air quality, swimming pools, housing, and more.
