- 8.** **Take the next step! Admissions staff will be available in the exhibitor area until 3 p.m.** Seniors – you can apply to BGSU, submit your housing payment or make your orientation reservation while you're here on campus.
- 9.** **Ready to tell the world you're a Falcon?** Seniors who submit their housing payment or make their orientation reservation today (or before!) can pick up an exclusive class of 2024 flag in the exhibitor area.

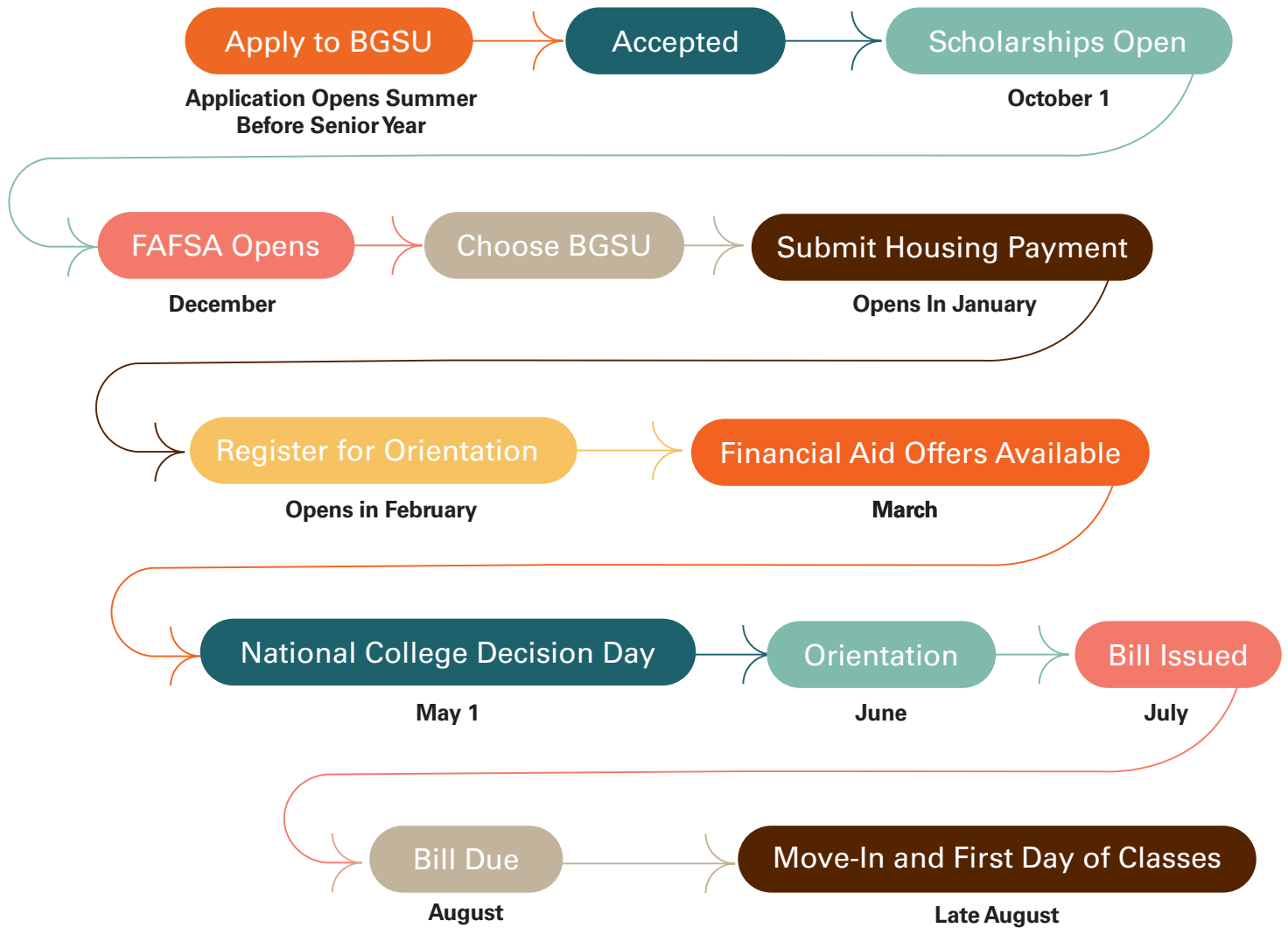

- Create your studentaid.gov username and password. This should be done 3 days in advance to ensure it has gone through proper channels for approval; a username and password is necessary for each contributor who will be needed on your FAFSA.
- Bring your studentaid.gov account username and password; a username and password is necessary for each contributor who will be needed on your FAFSA.
- Bring the contact information needed to invite contributors – legal names, emails, social security numbers and birthdates.
- Bring 2022 federal tax, income and asset information in case it is needed.

○ CONKLIN HALL \$\$ | D | C | AC

Conklin is a close-knit first-year community located near the Jerome Library and the Fine Arts Center. This is a wonderful option for you if you have an interest in the arts or like to study in a quiet place.

○ KREISCHER QUAD \$ | D | C | LC

Kreischer is the closest hall to sporting events and is great for students who like to attend a variety of games or who want to work out in the Recreation Center next door. Kreischer also has an All-Gender Housing floor for first-year students. Kreischer is the only hall with on-site, full-service dining.

WEST CAMPUS RESIDENCE HALLS

○ OFFENHAUER TOWERS \$\$ | S | D | C | LC | AC

With the math and science buildings across the street, this is a great location for STEM majors. If you want to guarantee a room in this building, we recommend checking out one of the four learning communities who call Offenhauer home.

Founders Hall is only available to new students who want to live in the Honors Learning Community, which requires an application and approval. We recommend touring this hall only if you are interested in joining the Honors Learning Community.
