

Scholars volunteered in December at the First United Methodist Church to help with their annual Christmas Workshop, providing activities and crafts for children in the community.






A small group of Thompson Family Scholars helped with the BG Winterfest Chocolate Crawl in February, answering questions and directing traffic in downtown Bowling Green.





Megan Harnish (2015 Cohort) hosted a DIY Canvas Paint Event at the Perrysburg Area Senior Center.


