Junior Audit Instructions

You must complete an official degree audit with a **College Advisor** during your junior year [60-89 hours]. To do so, you must schedule an appointment with a **College Advisor**. You should bring a completed copy of this check sheet and a current copy of your Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS) report. The **College Advisor** will provide you with a detailed form that specifies your remaining requirements for graduation.

To enter Capstone courses in Art Education (ARTE 4920 and ARTE 4970), you will need:

1. A "C" or better in GSW 1120, COMM 1020, and EDTL 2010;
2. Pass the School of Art Portfolio Review;
3. Completion of ARTE courses 2520, 3520, 3820, 4070, and 4520;
3. A 3.0 minimum GPA (If you are unable to maintain a 3.0 GPA, you MUST see your advisor to assist you in seeking alternative degree programs.);
4. Earn a passing score on the Visual Arts Content Ohio Assessment for Educators (OAE) test.

To graduate with a BFA degree in Art Education with Ohio licensure, candidates are required to:

1. Complete all BGP, and Arts & Sciences course requirements. Complete all Teacher Education and Art Education course requirements with letter grades (i.e. no S/U credits);
2. Earn passing score on the Educative Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA);
4. Earn passing scores on two Ohio Assessments for Educators (OAE) tests;
 - a. OAE test requirements are subject to change;
 - b. Check Ohio Department of Education requirements for Art Education at the point of licensure application; and
5. Pass a minimum of 138 credit hours.

Any substitution or waiver of courses required for your major or minor program must originate in the department/school offering the major or minor and must be approved by the College Office.

To ensure a timely graduation, see a **College Advisor** during the semester prior to your intended graduation.

Remember to complete an **Application for Graduation** by the end of the second week of classes during the fall or spring semester, or by the end of the first week of the summer semester. For the specific dates, check your DARS. You may log onto MyBGSU to complete the online application. After the deadlines, you will need to complete an application in person in the College Office.
