Communication

Each student is required to acquire proficiency in written expression. WRIT 1120 is required. Based on English placement tests, WRIT 1010 or 1110 may also be required. The Office of Student Services will provide placement information before the first semester. As a result of placement, a student may be required to take a total of 11 credits of writing. However, no more than six hours of basic writing can be applied toward graduation. Each student should also acquire proficiency in oral communication; a COMM or other oral communication course is strongly recommended.
