In the table below, circle the courses that you have completed. A course may be counted only once in the table. For example, ENG 2110, ENG 2120, and ENG 2750, appear in the American literature row in two time periods (1660-1900 and 1900-present), and ENG 4080 appears in the British literature row in two time periods (Before 1660 and 1660-1900). However, they can be used for one of the other but not both. Select the time period advantageous to you. 4000-level seminars may count for distribution requirement.
