

ACCOUNTING – 21 Hours

A specialization in the
Bachelor of Science in Business Administration

Students must meet the specialization requirements in effect at the time of their admission to the BSBA degree program.

To be admitted into the Accounting program, a student must:

- 1. attain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.6 including grades from all universities and colleges attended;**
- 2. complete a minimum of 51 semester hours of University credit;**
- 3. complete ACCT 2210 and 2220 with a grade of "C" or better in each.**

Note: BSBA admission is not a requirement for initial admission to the Accounting program, but is required for degree completion. To apply to the Accounting program, go to the AMIS Department.

The specific requirements for the **Accounting** specialization are as follows:

Notes:

- A grade of "C" or better must be earned in each course taken to satisfy requirements of the Accounting specialization.
- If planning to take the CPA examination, students are advised to take LEGS 4010 rather than LEGS 3010 as part of the business core.
