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




### Figure 1: Duration of first marriage among U.S. men and women whose first marriage ended in divorce: 2004

## Figure 3: Duration of second marriage for U.S. men and women whose second marriage ended in divorce: 2004









Figure 7: Percentage of men and women (ages 15-44) whose first marriage was dissolved by years since first marriage and educational attainment



## Figure 8: Percentage of men and women (ages 15-44) whose first marriage was dissolved by years since first marriage and cohabitation experience


