1 Sample description

The 2006-2010 National Survey of Family Growth (NSFG) is a continuous survey based on a nationally representative sample of the U.S. household population aged 15-44 years. The survey sample is designed to produce national data, not estimates for individual states. Consistent with previous cycles, the 2006-2010 NSFG contains interviews conducted with females and males 15-44 years of age. A female pregnancy file was also compiled, consisting of one record per pregnancy for all female respondents having experienced a pregnancy. Taken together, in-person interviews were completed with 22,682 respondents 15-44 years of age -- over 12,000 females and over 10,000 males. The interviews were voluntary and confidential.
